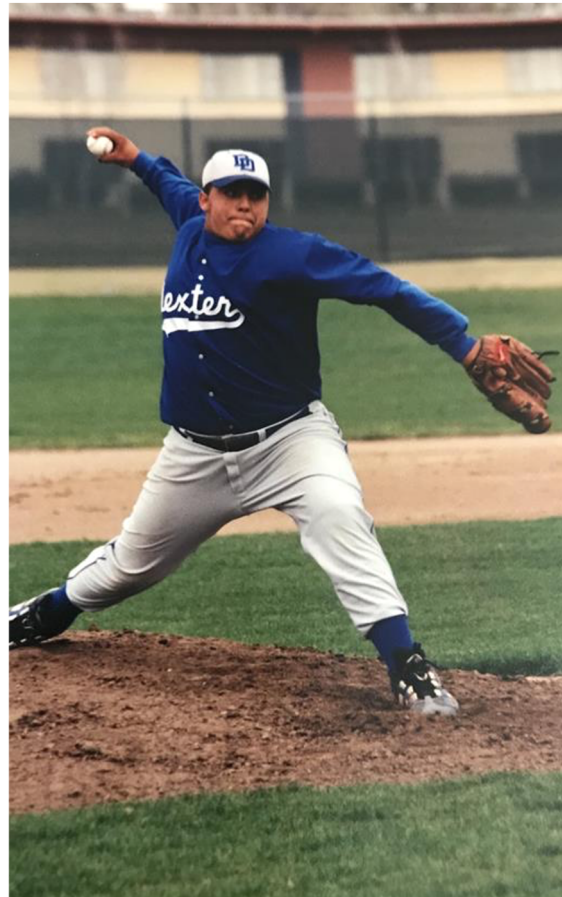
TONY REGALADO MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Tony Regalado Memorial Scholarship honors the extraordinary life of Tony Regalado—a proud Dexter, NM native whose life was deeply and passionately rooted in athletics.

From a young age, Tony exemplified a commitment to sports that extended far beyond the field. He was the only athlete in Dexter history to earn state championship rings in football (1997), baseball (1998), and basketball (2014), and was named to numerous All-State and All-District teams for football and baseball. He then attended college, pitching for the baseball team at New Mexico Military Institute. His unmatched talent, leadership, and work ethic defined him as a student-athlete and as a person.

Tony's devotion to athletics wasn't limited to his own success—he found great joy in mentoring youth, coaching at Dexter Middle and High School, umpiring little league games, and supporting the next generation of athletes in his community. Tony's life revolved around the joy of sport and the power of connection.

He lived with heart, always putting others first, and remains an enduring example of sportsmanship, selflessness, and love for community. This scholarship is awarded to New Mexico student-athletes who embody the same dedication, character, and spirit that Tony carried with him every day.





TONY REGALADO MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This application is for a four-year scholarship, subject to confirmation of the required grade point average (GPA) and enrollment verification. One recipient will be awarded this scholarship annually and will receive \$1,000/semester for a maximum of eight (8) semesters.

The scholarship committee may determine that scholarships of lower amounts/duration will be awarded on the basis of funds available and the applicant pool.

Eligibility:

- Applicant must be a student graduating from a New Mexico high school in 2026.
- Applicants must have a minimum cumulative high school GPA of 3.0, as verified by a submitted high school transcript.
- Student-Athletes will be given higher consideration.
- Economic need will be given higher consideration.
- Applicants must embody the spirit of Tony Regalado as shown in at least one (1) but no more than (3) letter(s) of recommendation from preferably a coach, but also a teacher, principal, community leader, etc.
- Applications must be received no later than April 1st at 11:59 p.m. MDT. Awards will be announced within forty-five (45) days of this date.
- When the scholarship includes more than one semester, applicants 1) must maintain a 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale, 2) be considered a full-time (12 credit hours) student by the registrar, 3) agree to send the HUU Foundation proof of enrollment and official transcripts, and 4) uphold the spirit and character of Tony Regalado.
